

The Liturgy for Palm Sunday

April 10th, 2022



A warm welcome to this united service in which our two parishes come together for worship at the start of Holy Week.

Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, with a blessing of palms and a procession in which the whole congregation carries palms, and witnesses to Jesus Christ as King in their own parish communities. The day is also marked by reading the story of Jesus' Passion (the word used to describe Jesus' death comes from 'suffering', which is one old meaning of passion). This takes us to the heart of Holy Week, reminding us that the kingly power of Christ is the power of self-giving love.

Please ensure mobile telephones are switched off for the duration of the service.

For those who are hard of hearing the church has an inductive loop system. Please set your hearing aid to the T position during the liturgy.

Gluten free hosts are available for those who are gluten intolerant. Please ask for this before the service begins.

THE BLESSING OF PALMS & PROCESSION OF WITNESS

Hosanna to the Son of David, the King of Israel.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest!

The priest welcomes the people.

The Lord be with you.
And also with you.

The Palm Sunday Gospel

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Mark.
Glory to you, O Lord.

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.' '

They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

'Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

Then Jesus entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
Praise to you, O Christ.

The Procession

Priest Let us go forth, praising Jesus our Messiah.
All **In the name of the Lord. Amen.**

Please follow the Great Cross as we move from St Stephen's to St Matthew's.

As we will be on public roads please try to keep pace so the procession holds together.

The Procession is a dramatic way to recall and celebrate the beginning of these days of the passion and death of Our Lord. Palm crosses and branches are carried although they are secondary to the procession itself. The procession does not simply remind us of what happened in the past - it is in itself an act of praise to Christ. However our praise is offered to the One whose reign is on a cross, and it expresses our readiness to take up our cross and follow our crucified and risen Lord, as we go with him to the place of suffering and death.

I danced in the morning when the world was begun,

And I'll lead you all in the dance, said he.*

They cut me down and I leapt up high;
I am the life that'll never, never die;
I'll live in you if you'll live in me:
I am the Lord of the Dance, said he:

*Dance, then, wherever you may be;
I am the Lord of the Dance, said he,
And I'll lead you all, wherever you may be,
And I'll lead you all in the dance, said he.*

As we enter St Matthew's we sing:

To thee before thy passion
They sang their hymns of praise:
To thee, now high exalted,
Our melody we raise:

Thou didst accept their praises,
Accept the prayers we bring,
Who in all good delightest,
Thou good and gracious King:

Do thou direct our footsteps
Upon our earthly way,
And bring us by thy mercy
To heaven's eternal day.

Within that blessèd City
Thy praises may we sing,
And ever raise hosannas
To our most loving King.

As the clergy & servers enter the church the choir sing:

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

Philippians 2. 5-11

A Reading from the second Letter of Paul the Apostle to the Philippians.

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness.

And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The Word of The Lord.

Thanks be to God.

Psalm 64. 1-4

*Hear my voice, O God, in my prayer * preserve my life from fear of the enemy.
Hide me from the gathering together of the froward * and from the insurrection of wicked doers;
Who have whet their tongue like a sword * and shoot out their arrows, even bitter words;
That they may privily shoot at him that is perfect * suddenly do they hit him, and fear not.*

The Passion Gospel

St Luke 22.39 – 23.49

No responses are made after the announcement or at the end of the Passion Gospel.

*The congregation are invited to join in the parts in **bold type**, and to stand at the point indicated in the text.*

Evangelist Jesus came out, and went, as was his custom, to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples followed him. And when he came to the place he said:

Jesus Pray that you may not enter into temptation.

Evangelist And he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and knelt down and prayed:

Jesus Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; nevertheless not my will, but yours, be done.

Evangelist And there appeared to him an angel from heaven strengthening him. And being in an agony he prayed more earnestly; and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down upon the ground. And when he rose from prayer, he came to the disciples and found them sleeping for sorrow, and he said to them:

Jesus Why do you sleep? Rise and pray that you may not enter into temptation.

Evangelist While he was still speaking, there came a crowd, and the man called Judas, one of the twelve, was leading them. He drew near to Jesus to kiss him; but Jesus said to him:

Jesus Judas, would you betray the Son of man with a kiss?

Evangelist And when those who were about him saw what would follow, they said:

Disciples (All) **Lord, shall we strike with the sword?**

Evangelist And one of them struck the slave of the high priest and cut off his right ear. But Jesus said:

Jesus No more of this!

Evangelist And he touched his ear and healed him. Then he said to the chief priests and captains of the Temple and elders who had come out against him:

Jesus Have you come out as against a robber, with swords and clubs? When I was with you day after day in the Temple, you did not lay hands on me. But this is your hour, and the power of darkness.

Evangelist Then they seized him and led him away, bringing him into the high priest's house. Peter followed at distance; and when they had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat down together, Peter sat among them.

Then a maid, seeing him as he sat in the light and gazing at him, said:

Maid This man also was with him.

Evangelist But he denied it:

Peter Woman, I do not know him.

Evangelist And a little later some one else saw him and said:

Bystander 1 You also are one of them.

Peter Man, I am not.

Evangelist And after an interval of about an hour, still another insisted:

Bystander 2 Certainly this man also was with him; for he is a Galilean.

Peter Man, I do not know what you are saying.

Evangelist And immediately, while he was still speaking, the cock crowed. And the Lord turned and looked at Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said to him, 'Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times'. And he went out and wept bitterly. Now the men who were holding Jesus mocked him and beat him; they also blindfolded him and asked him:

Men (All) **Prophecy! Who is it that struck you?**

Evangelist And they spoke many other words against him, reviling him.

When day came, the assembly of the elders of the people gathered together, both chief priests and scribes; and they led him away to their council, and they said:

Priests (All) **If you are the Christ, tell us.**

Jesus If I tell you, you will not believe; and if I ask you, you will not answer. But from now on the Son of man shall be seated at the right hand of the power of God.

Priests (All) **Are you the Son of God, then?**

Jesus You say that I am.

Priests (All) **What further testimony do we need?
We have heard it ourselves from his own lips.**

Evangelist Then the whole company of them arose, and brought him before Pilate. And they began to accuse him:

Priests (All) **We found this man perverting our nation, and forbidding us to give tribute to Caesar, and saying that he himself is Christ a king.**

Pilate Are you the King of the Jews?

Jesus You have said so.

Pilate (*to the priests*) I find no crime in this man.

Priests (All) (*urgently*) **He stirs up the people, teaching throughout all Judea, from Galilee even to this place.**

Evangelist When Pilate heard this, he asked whether the man was a Galilean. And when he learned that he belonged to Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him over to Herod, who was himself in Jerusalem at that time. When Herod saw Jesus, he was very glad, for he had long desired to see him, because he had heard about him, and he was hoping to see some sign done by him. So he questioned him at length but Jesus made no answer. The chief priests and scribes stood by, vehemently accusing him. And Herod with his soldiers treated him with contempt and mocked him; then, arraying him in gorgeous apparel, he sent him back to Pilate. And Herod and Pilate became friends with each other that very day, for before this they had been at enmity with each other. Pilate then called together the chief priests and rulers of the people, and said to them:

Pilate You brought me this man as one who was perverting the people; and after examining him before you, behold, I did not find this man guilty of any of your charges against him; neither did Herod, for he sent him back to us. Behold, nothing

deserving death has been done by him; I will therefore chastise him and release him.

Evangelist But they all cried out together:

The Congregation stands

Priests (All) **Away with this man, and release to us Barabbas.**

Evangelist A man who had been thrown into prison for an insurrection started in the city, and for murder. Pilate addressed them once more, desiring to release Jesus; but they shouted out:

Priests (All) **Crucify him, crucify him!**

Evangelist A third time he spoke to them:

Pilate Why? What evil has he done? I have found in him no crime deserving death; I will therefore chastise him and release him.

Evangelist But they were urgent, demanding with loud cries that he should be crucified. And their voices prevailed. So Pilate gave sentence that their demand should be granted. He released the man who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and murder, whom they asked for; but Jesus he delivered up to their will. And as they led him away, they seized one Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country and laid on him the cross, to carry it behind Jesus. And there followed him a great multitude of the people, and of women who bewailed and lamented him. But Jesus turning to them said:

Jesus Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. For behold, the days are coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never gave suck!' Then they will begin to say to the mountains, 'Fall on us'; and to the hills, 'Cover us'. For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?

Evangelist Two others also, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with him. And when they came to the place which is called The Skull, there they crucified him, and the criminals, one on the right and one on the left. And Jesus said:

Jesus Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do.

Evangelist And they cast lots to divide his garments. And the people stood by, watching; but the rulers scoffed at him:

Priests (All) **He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!**

Evangelist The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him vinegar:

Soldiers (All) **If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!**

Evangelist There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews'. One of the criminals who were hanged railed at him:

Robber 1 Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!

Evangelist But the other rebuked him:

Robber 2 Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed justly; for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus, remember me when you come in your kingly power.

Jesus Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.

Evangelist It was now about the sixth hour, and there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour, while the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the Temple was torn in two. Then Jesus cried with a loud voice:

Jesus Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.

Evangelist And having said this he breathed his last. Now when the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God:

Centurion Certainly this man was innocent!

Evangelist And all the multitudes who assembled to see the sight, when they saw what had taken place, returned home beating their breasts. But all his acquaintances, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things.

Evangelist This is the Passion of The Lord.
(*no response is made*).
