Easter Day

The church is darkened, and the West Door opened

Please remain in your seats, as the liturgy of the New Fire is broadcast into the church.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ.

This is the day when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life.

Throughout the world Christians celebrate the awesome power of God.

As we hear his word and proclaim all that God has done, we can be confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever.

The Lighting of the New Fire

Outside the church, accompanied by prayers:

- *the Paschal Candle is signed with the cross;*
- *grains of incense, marking the wounds of Christ, are inserted;*
- *the Candle is lighted from the new fire.*

Christ yesterday and today,
the beginning and the end,

Alpha and Omega,
all time belongs to him, and all ages;
**to him be glory and power,
through every age and for ever. Amen.**

By his holy and glorious wounds
may Christ our Lord guard and keep us.
Amen.

The president lights the Paschal Candle, saying

May the light of Christ,
rising in glory,
banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.
Amen.

The Deacon carrying the Candle raises it and sings

The light of Christ.
Thanks be to God.

Candles are lit from the Paschal Candle.

At the entrance to the church

The light of Christ.
Thanks be to God.

At the Font:

The light of Christ.
Thanks be to God.

The Exsultet (*Easter Song of Praise*)
Sung by the Deacon, during which we respond:

The Lord be with you
and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.
We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
It is right to give thanks and praise.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.
To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

Profession of Faith

Do you believe and trust in God the Father,
who made the world?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ,
who redeemed mankind?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit,
who gives life to the people of God?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

**We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.**

The congregation is sprinkled with water to remind us of our Baptism

The First Eucharist of Easter

President: Jesus Christ is risen

Deacon: He is risen indeed.

President: Jesus Christ is risen

Deacon/sidespeople: He is risen indeed, Alleluia!

President: Jesus Christ is risen

All: **He is risen indeed, Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!**

Hymn

Gloria in Excelsis

**Glory to God in the highest,
and peace to his people on earth.**

**Lord God, heavenly King,
almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks,
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world:
have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father:
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,
you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High,
Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

The Collect *for Easter Day*

Lord of all life and power,
who through the mighty resurrection of your Son overcame the old
order of sin and death to make all things new in him: grant that we,
being dead to sin and alive to you in Jesus Christ, may reign with him in
glory; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be praise and honour,
glory and might, now and in all eternity. **Amen.**

The Liturgy of the Word

New Testament Reading

At the end the reader says

This is the word of the Lord.
Thanks be to God.

Gradual Hymn

The Gospel Reading

Alleluia! Alleluia!

I am the first and the last, says the Lord, and the living one;
I was dead, and behold I am alive for evermore.

Alleluia!

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.
Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end the reader says

This is the Gospel of the Lord.
Praise to you, O Christ.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

All stand

The Peace

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples
and said 'Peace be with you'.

Then were they glad when they saw the Lord.

Alleluia! The peace of the risen Christ be always with you
and also with you. Alleluia!

Lift up your hearts.

Sanctus and Benedictus

The president praises God for his mighty acts and all respond

**Holy, holy, holy,
Lord God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

The president recalls the Last Supper and this acclamation is used

Great is the mystery of faith:
**Christ has died:
Christ is risen:
Christ will come again.**

The prayer continues and leads into the doxology to which all respond

Amen.

All kneel

The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray

**Our Father,
who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come, thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread,
and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, the power,
and the glory for ever and ever. Amen.**

The Breaking of the Bread

The president breaks the consecrated bread, saying

We break this bread
to share in the body of Christ.
**Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

Agnus Dei

**Jesus, Lamb of God,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, bearer of our sins,
have mercy on us.**

**Jesus, redeemer of the world,
grant us your peace.**

Distribution of Communion

Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.
Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!

The president and people receive communion

*The communicant replies each time **Amen**, and then receives.*

Post Communion Prayer

God of Life,
who for our redemption
gave your only-begotten Son
to the death of the cross,
and by his glorious resurrection
have delivered us from the power of our enemy:
grant us so to die daily to sin,
that we may evermore live with him in the joy of his risen life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Loving God,
whether we are in your church or joining online from another place,
we give you thanks for restoring us in your image and
nourishing us with spiritual food
in the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood.
Now send us forth a people forgiven, healed, and renewed;
that we may proclaim your love to the world and
continue in the risen life of Christ our Saviour.
Amen.**
