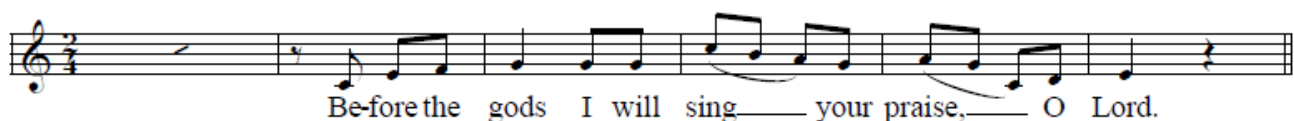
The Collect
